Valentine's Day Luncheon



Once again, we will have a luncheon after church service on February 15 celebrating Valentine's Day. Our luncheon will be catered by Olive Garden with a "Pasta Bar" including choice of 2 pastas, 3 sauces, choice of sausage or meatballs, garden salad, bread sticks, and dessert. Groundhog Day

Groundhog Day is a tradition observed regionally in the United States and Canada on February 2 of every year. It derives from the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if a groundhog emerges from its burrow on this day and sees its shadow, it will retreat to its den and winter will go on for six more weeks; if it does not see its shadow, spring will arrive early.

The weather lore was brought from German-speaking areas where the badger is the forecasting animal, while in Hungary, the bear serves the same purpose, and badgers were only watched when bears were not around. It is related to the lore that clear weather on the Christian festival of Candlemas forebodes a prolonged winter.

The Groundhog Day ceremony held at Punxsutawney in western Pennsylvania, centering on a semi-mythical groundhog named Punxsutawney Phil, has become the most frequently attended ceremony. Grundsow Lodges in Pennsylvania Dutch Country in the southeastern part of the state observe the occasion as well. Other cities in the United States and Canada also have adopted the event.

While the tradition remains popular in the 21st century, studies have found no consistent association between a groundhog seeing its shadow and the subsequent arrival time of spring-like weather.

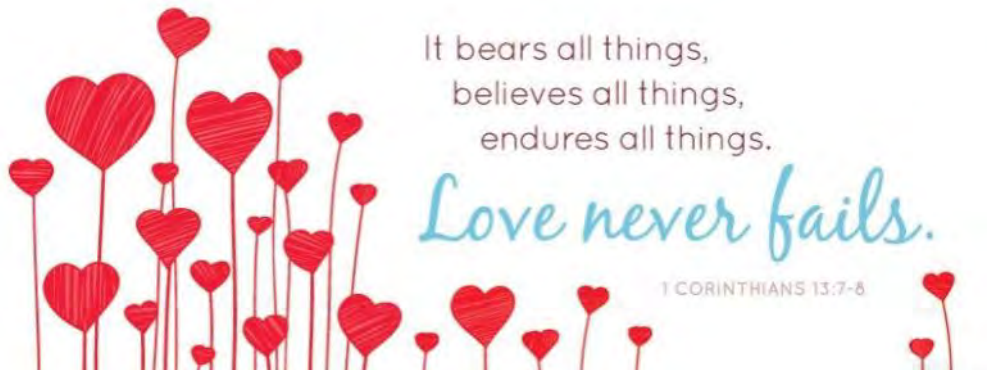

Pumpkin Streusel Coffee Cake

As served by Margeat Women of Faith

Cake

1 yellow cake mix
4 T. unsalted butter, softened
3 eggs
1 can (15 oz) pumpkin
1 tsp. cinnamon
1/2 c. pecans

Mix

Topping

3/4 c. brown sugar
1/2 c. flour
4 T. butter
1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
Mix and spread on cake.

Bake: Use 9"x13" pan - prepared. Bake 375 degrees for 45 minutes.

Red Velvet Mug Cake

1 Serving - 10 Minutes

This boldly colored beauty may look boring on the outside, but there's gooey cream cheese frosting hidden in the center.

Ingredients

6 Tbsp. all-purpose flour
2 Tbsp. granulated sugar
1 tsp. unsweetened cocoa powder
1/4 tsp. baking powder
1/8 tsp. kosher salt
1/3 cup whole milk

2 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
2 tsp. pure vanilla extract
1 tsp. red food coloring
3 Tbsp. confectioners' sugar
1 Tbsp. cream cheese,
at room temperature

Directions

In a 12-ounce mug, whisk together flour, sugar, cocoa powder, baking powder, and salt. Stir in milk, butter, vanilla, and food coloring. In a small bowl, mix together confectioners' sugar and cream cheese until smooth, then drop into mug and push down until covered by batter. Microwave on High until just cooked through, about 90 seconds.

Cheesy Tortilla Soup

Ingredients

1 envelope chicken fajita seasoning mix
1 pound boneless skinless chicken breasts, diced
2 tablespoons canola oil
1/2 cup chopped onion
1/4 cup butter, cubed
1/3 cup all-purpose flour
2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) chicken broth
1/3 cup canned diced tomatoes with chilies
1 cup cubed process cheese (Velveeta)
1-1/2 cups (6 ounces) shredded Monterey Jack cheese, divided
1-1/2 cups half-and-half cream
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
Added a bag of corn
Guacamole and tortilla chips

Directions

Prepare fajita mix according to package directions; add chicken and marinate as directed. In a large skillet, cook chicken in oil until no longer pink; set aside.

In a large saucepan, sauté onion in butter until tender. Stir in flour until blended. Gradually stir in broth. Bring to a boil. Cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened and bubbly. Add the tomatoes, process cheese and 1 cup Monterey Jack; cook and stir until cheese is melted.

Stir in cream and reserved chicken; heat through (do not boil). Sprinkle with cheddar and remaining Monterey Jack cheese; top with guacamole and chips.

Yield: 8 servings (2 quarts)
